Origins & Authority

- A persistent effort by the Brockville Historical Society in the 1970's resulted in the establishment of the Brockville Museum in 1981, in the "Beecher House" on Henry Street.
- By-law 287-89 established and authorized the Board of Management to govern and operate the Brockville Museum.
- Another persistent effort created the "Carriage Hall" in 1995, greatly expanding exhibit, storage and programming space.
- April 2022 is the date that is persistently on our minds. The opening of the new, expanded, relocated, state of the art Brockville Museum, coinciding with the 200th Anniversary of the City of Brockville.

Board Governance

- Beyond establishing objectives and timelines, governance is about how we accomplish our goals. Governance permeates everything that we do.
- Our By-laws and terms of reference guide our overall management.
- We share the same rigorous standards developed by the Curator/Director and staff to meet Canadian and Ontario Museum Association requirements.
